

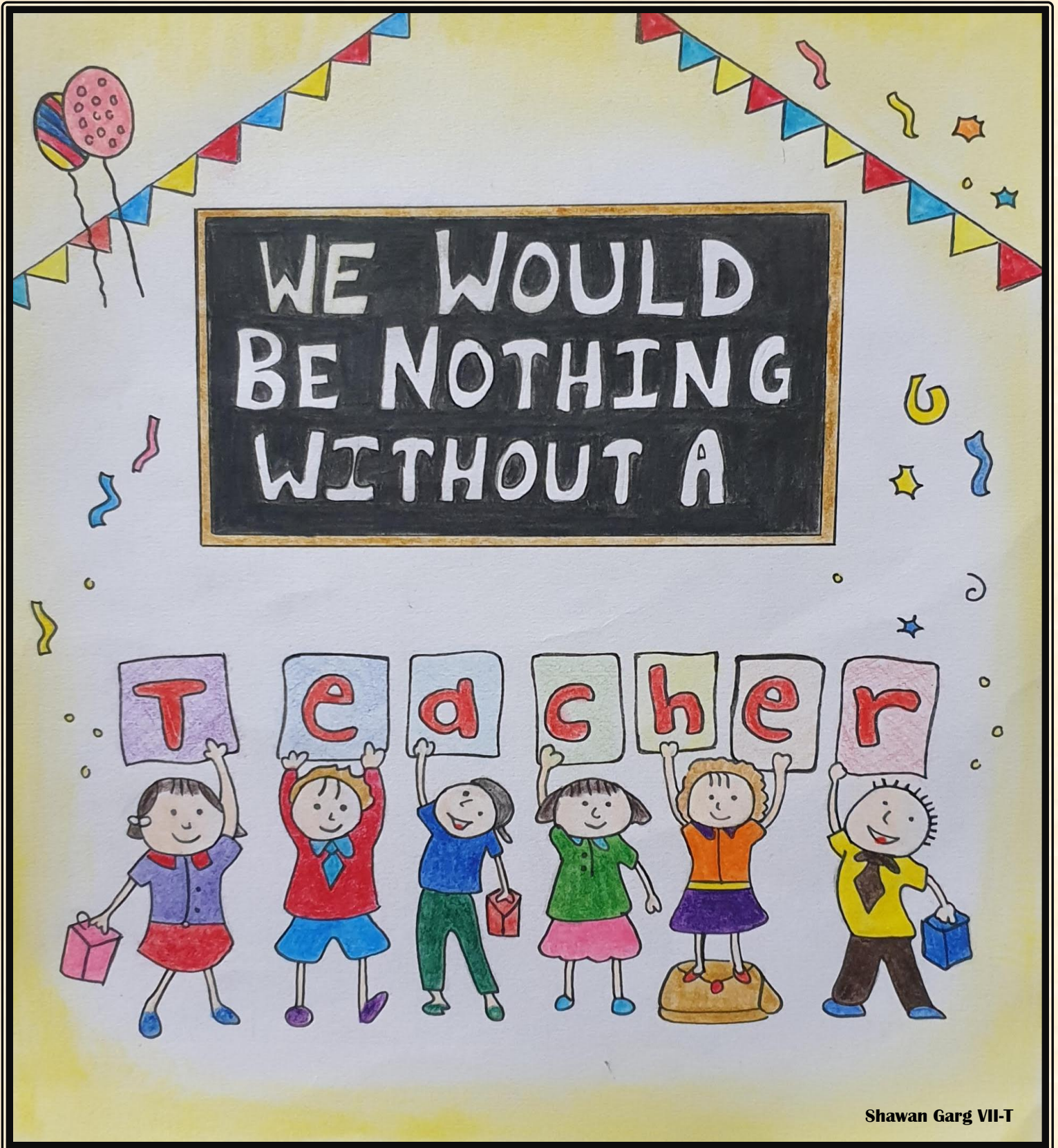

VISIT TO GOVERNMENT PRIMARY SCHOOL, KAILON

Day 01: 19th July, 2018

Twelve students from Classes XI and XII went to the Government Primary School, Kailon and distributed snacks there.

The students got the opportunity to interact with the students and staff members. The teachers were quite open to all kinds of questions. They expressed concern over a wide range of problems, from lack of necessities to actually getting kids to come to school. These were essentially children from poverty-stricken backgrounds. As we were told, some of them did not have any footwear when they first came to school and had to be bathed in the school itself, on more than one occasion.



The school authorities told us that the kids of this school had been the Runners up in the District Kabaddi Competition and took part in a variety of other activities including Calligraphy.

Day 02: 9th August, 2018

Fifteen students visited the Government Primary School, Kailon.

YPS had carried out a collection drive for two weeks. Toys, books and stationery items were collected for donation to the students there. Our school also provided them thirty chairs for their pre-primary class as the same was requested by their teacher.

In each class an interactive session was held with the kids, creating awareness about prevention of vector borne diseases like dengue, malaria and chikungunya. This was followed by a delightful session of entertainment with the children reciting poems and putting up group performances of *bhangra* and *gidha* and even singing songs.

The visits were indeed helpful as it led students to introspect and helped them understand that happiness is not just in materialistic things. The students realized that they should make the most of the opportunities that they get and the importance that sharing carries.
