The online classes for the session of 2020-2021, turned education on its head. But the teaching faculty of YPS, Mohali took up the challenge with positivity and vigor.

While the school took up the up gradation of the IT infrastructure, the teachers honed their skills to deal with the online classes in a short stint of time. The summer vacation were preponed and within a month the teachers were ready with their time tables, lesson plans and a curriculum with integrated activities designed to accentuate learning and development. Google platform was selected as the mode of online classes after due consideration which was integrated with the email Ids generated for all students. The programme was ably supported by the IT department.

Though the timetable was designed to keep the students engaged it kept in mind the issues related to screen time. The senior wing started with 5 lessons while the junior wing and kindergarten started with 3 lessons of a duration of 40 minutes and a break of 20 minutes in between the lessons to keep the students and teachers energised.

YPS KG Wing conducted the very first Virtual Poetry Recitation, Story Narration, Role Play, Sports Day, Kinder Artist Display, Annual show, Special Assemblies and Show and Tell to know the significance of our festivals and respect for all cultures.

The school had to rework its curriculum keeping in mind the additions and reductions as specified by the Council from time to time. The teachers worked out the syllabus to string it for continuity of the topics in their respective subjects.

Well being classes such as Art, Music, Sports and Emotional Well Being were introduced for the middle school in the evening. The students were guided with the aid of presentations and Videos as well as live demonstrations to have a meaningful interaction.

Support lessons for the students were also conducted in the evening for the students to clear their doubts.

We believe that work not assessed is work not done. Regular assessments were made through Structured Internal Assessments (SIA) and Wednesday Tests.

Inter House co-curricular events like debates, poetry recitations were organised to keep the competitive edge among the students. They also took part in the various online Inter School competitions and won laurels for the school.

A connect was established with the parents through Parent teacher meetings (PTM) and one to one interactions.



The lockdown of schools in India to confront the effects of COVID-19 caused an enormous impact at both social and educational levels. Schools and families had to react rapidly to a new teaching and learning scenario without the benefit of previous planning or government guidelines. In this context, YPS, Mohali was certainly able to adapt to the new circumstances in a better manner. The School went in complete lockdown on 13th March 2020 way before the country lockdown was announced. However, the administrative and the support Staff worked day and night to ensure the upkeep of the office

work and the school campus. Our School was declared a NO-COVID ZONE as no outsiders were allowed entry into the school premises. [IAYP REPORT]



The students were involved in the following service sections under the IAYP programme.


OLYMPIAD

" The Social Sciences have a critical contribution to make, in helping us understand, imagine, and craft a more sustainable future for all."



MATHEMATICS

The year 2020 was challenging one for the Mathematics department as it was a purely online teaching / learning experience. The teachers made it funfilled, hands on, activity based teaching and, tried their best to clear the concepts. It was done by involving the students, showing interesting videos, storytelling and doing Mental Maths on a daily basis to increase their mental ability. Jodo gyan teaching aids helped a lot in making the topics clear. CPA method was as usual followed.

Curriculum based research work and projects were also given to the students in order to nurture their inquisitive minds














COMPUTERS

Technology has played an important role in responding to the novel corona virus. In many contexts, technology has provided learning continuity when students were not present physically in the classrooms. However, there were many barriers to successful online virtual real-time learning driven by technology, including teacher preparedness, access to online resources and devices, and student support at home. While teaching computers we tried to make our lessons more engaging and interesting so that children will get 100% participation in representing their work during real-time virtual learning. We taught different applications by giving virtual demos for more clarity of different concepts and we got wonderful response from students' end. Children learnt various software like MS Paint, WordPad, MS Word, and MS PowerPoint throughout the year. Children displayed the best of creativity and apply their technical learning in their projects.







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PUNJABI and HINDI

In online classes, all efforts were made to ensure that children are able to transition from offline classes to online teaching seamlessly. Learning concepts was made easier by using videos, demonstrations, storytelling, short exercises, creative writing, and recitations in addition to regular lessons.

Focus has been to help children gain confidence in speaking Hindi and learn how to write. In the last recitation competition, children were asked independently to choose their own poem. The children showed great enthusiasm and interest in carefully selecting the poem and reciting it. It was a pleasure to see the growth in children.

INDIAN AND WESTERN MUSIC

Music teaches the children the sense and power of rhythm. Indian Music Education at Junior Wing begins with introduction of basic swar, concept of taal and introduction of classical music. The students learnt different types of songs e.g. festival songs. Patriotic songs, action song, prayers etc in Hindi & Punjabi. Rhythm exercises were also taught to students to help them understand the element of time in music.

The students were encouraged, shortlisted and selected for 'Virtual Music Inter School Competition' on 6th February, 2021 and regular practice and training was given to the selected students to improve their performance There was no hindrance in teaching music online during the Pandemic. The only setback was that instead of having one class every week it was one class every three weeks. Therefore, the curriculum was shortened and effective measures were taken.

The classes went really well and the students enjoyed the Western Music Activity classes as most of the songs taught during the online classes were action based where students had to stand up and follow the teacher as he sings and performs the actions. So, the students learned music as well as performed some form of physical activity which was helpful during the lockdown.

A different approach was taken by the teacher by

introducing Western classical Instruments and Classical music in the second term, where the students learned how each instrument sounds like and also their different categories. Special music appreciation lessons were taken to encourage students to have more interest in music and arts.

ART AND CRAFT

During online classes, we tried to build a free learning environment for kids to explore the material and various techniques and express themselves. They learned about colour theory, elements of art, origami, doodle art, collage, compositions, various artists work and portrait making folk art.

Children (classes I to V) participated in the activity 'Hum fit to India fit'.

An art activity was organised on Armed forces Flag Day.

Children of class IV enthusiastically participated in the ISA project.

ACTIVITY CLASSES : SPECIAL OCCASIONS AND FESTIVALS

The Performing Arts and Art department worked together under a newly christened 'Activity' Department. 'YPS Creative Initiative' was the first feather in the cap that included a compilation of videos of children's performances under the guidance of teachers. Various national, religious and cultural festivals and occasions were celebrated online with due pomp and grandeur to foster national integration, religious and cultural awareness and tolerance. Morning assembly was also conducted House wise with a teacher dedicated to all sections of each level. Participation of all children was ensured.

All students of classes I to V presented their skills in music, dance, oration and arts enthusiastically for various theme based projects. Their video entries were compiled in an audio-visual montage and showcased in the evening classes and in some morning assemblies too. ACADEMIC ACHIEVERS

Yadavindra Public School, Mohali, has the distinction of providing high-quality education as well as opportunities to participate in various Inter-House, Inter-School and Sports activities. The holistic development of our children is the focus of one and all present in the school (the authorities, the teaching staff and the administrative staff). We, at YPS, Mohali prepare global citizens, who are equipped with the necessary information and skills to face the fast changing competitive world.

In the session of 2020-21, 72 students took the class XII (ISC) Examination. The students did their alma mater proud by notching up an exemplary result. 34 students scored above 90%. Out of these students, 18 students scored more than 95% marks. The cherry on cake was hat all 72 students scored First Division marks!

The Tri-city toppers added feathers to the crown of YPS, Mohali, as we had the Tri-city toppers in the Science and the Commerce stream! In the Science (Medical) stream, Pavit Kaur and Tanveer Mangat topped the Tri-city with 97.75%. In Commerce, Sehajpreet Kaur achieved 96.25%. Some of the other meritorious students were: In the Humanities Stream, Jasnoor Kaur topped YPS with 98.5%; Abhinav Pratap Singh, Agamnoor Dhillon, Deepkiran Dhingra followed with 98.25% and Gunjeet Singh Bhullar stood third scoring 98%. In the Medical Stream, Harsimrat Kaur Buttar scored 94%. In the Non-Medical Stream, Jashanjot Singh Chahal scored 94.5% and Sukhali Aulakh secured 91.25.In the Commerce Stream, Avneet Kaur Taak was placed second with 94%.

116 students took the class 10 ICSE Examination. We secured a 100% result. 43 students scored above 90% marks. 8 students secured 95% and above. All 116 students secured First Division marks.

Aafreen Kaur stood First in the school, with 97% marks, Divyam Goel was a close Second with 96.6%, followed by Jivitesh Singh Batth and Shivika Kaushal with 96.2%.

YPS, Mohali is proud of their achievements. The Session 2019-20 had just ended when the world was hit by a terror that took its toll and left the people devastated and stunned. There was panic all around; but, not at YPS, Mohali. The first step was to control the fear and panic of the pandemic. This was done by announcing the summer break ahead of the scheduled duration. The children portrayed utmost courage during such tough times and were ready to resume their journey of school life.

The big question was: how to impart education to the child in spite of inevitable odds. Amidst this catastrophic situation, Yadavindrians exhibited its motto in the true sense. The motto VIDYA, VINAY, VEERTA is what made the ship of YPS sail on in spite of the tempest of the pandemic. The authorities, like true leaders, involved themselves into a lot of research and reflection, culminating in an urge to reach out to the children. Knowing that Time does not wait for anyone, the school decided to use Google Meet as a platform to provide quality education to the students. The course of argument was: If children cannot reach the school building, the school can reach out to them and hence started the process of adapting to the situation and adopting new techniques of teaching.

School activities were carried out as usual but with a slight twist- everything for the first time in the history of the school, was conducted virtually. The oft read science-fiction stories of a virtual world had now turned into a reality!





Class 11 students presented a virtual dance performance, renditions of melodious songs, and a quiz on the history of YPS, Mohali.


The outgoing Head boy and the Head girl delivered their farewell speeches and the event culminated by describing each student of the outgoing batch by saying one liners about them.


