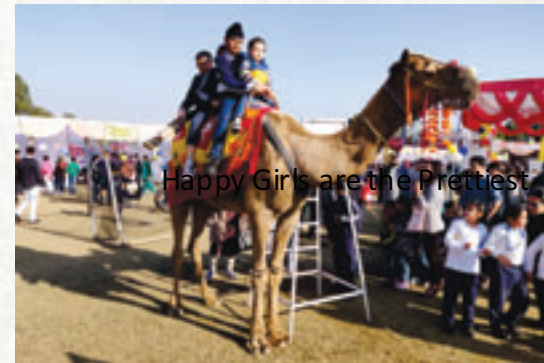

IAYP REPORT



The award programme was first introduced in the United Kingdom in 1956 as the Duke of Edinburgh's award and today it is called the International Award for Young People (IAYP). The aim is to motivate young adults aged between 14 and 25 years to become involved in a programme of voluntary self-development activities.

The basic structure of the award consists of four mandatory sections- service, adventurous journey, skills, and physical recreation. There were a total of sixty-nine participants in the session of 2018-19 for the IAYP programme. Fifty-seven students vied for the bronze level and twelve competed for the silver level.

The students were involved in the following services under the IAYP programme:

1. IAYP partnered with the Municipal Corporation, Mohali, for the Swachh Bharat Mission. Tarandeep Kaur and her team led drives to create awareness for

cleanliness in Mohali.

2. IAYP hobby students of class IX and X took up a project on recycling of waste plastic pens.
3. The IAYP hobby team took up another project on re-cycling waste paper.
4. The IAYP hobby students identified and studied the various species of birds found in the campus area.
5. 'Each one teach one' - a programme on educating young ones was initiated by IAYPians.
6. A project on the conservation and study of birds was taken up by IAYP-boarders team.
7. Tree plantation and upkeep of adopted trees was taken up by the boarders-IAYP team.

A total of five awards, two bronze and three silver awards, have been presented to the students on successful completion of their respective levels.

ACADEMIC/ NON ACADEMIC REPORT

Keeping this principle in mind, a holistic curriculum is followed to build a wholesome foundation at YPS Junior Wing.

ENGLISH

“Language shapes the way we think and determines what we can think about.”

English is the third most spoken language in the world. It is widely learnt as the second language. It is therefore essential to master English, so as to communicate with one another with relative ease.

The basic skills of Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing are enhanced by the various activities done in class, library and during Morning Assembly. Just A Minute, Spin A Yarn, Recitations, Declamation, Elocution, Role Play are all interspersed in the curriculum to boost the confidence of the young learners.

English provides an apt platform to the students to express themselves freely and

creatively, which in turn is reflected in their daily work and in their articles/ poems published in the Oracle.

MATHEMATICS

Practice of Mental Math, tables and regular recapitulation are the core areas in which we ensure that the children achieve a level above the otherwise expected one. This has helped them gain confidence and love the subject.

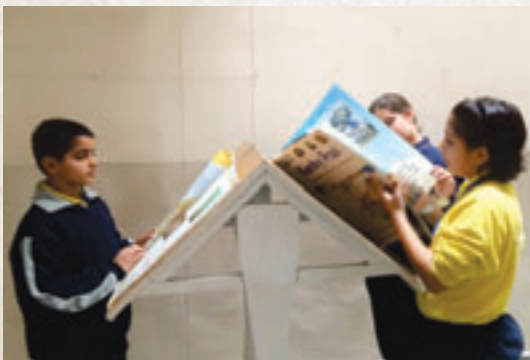

above 90%, 24 scored above 80% and 24 were placed above 70%.

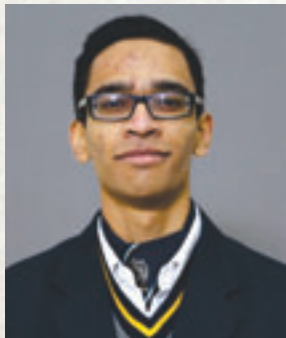

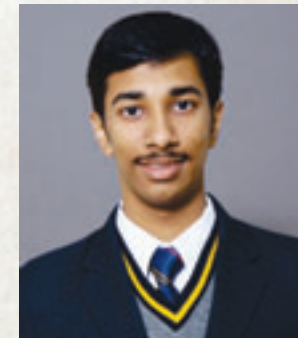

COUNSELLING REPORT

- YPS follows a 'CHILD CENTERED' approach to education, for which the school counselor provided specialized support to the students with social, emotional, behavioral and academics problems.
- The counselling cell worked in tandem with all the teaching departments to identify students struggling in academic and non-academic activities and solve the issues.
- Extensive psycho- educational assessments were made to diagnose problems like social adjustment, sibling rivalry, parental discord, hysterical and anxiety disorders.
- A training workshop was also conducted for the teaching staff to hone their counselling skills as well identifying kids with psychological problems within the classroom.

- With the POCSO ACT in mind, a special safety curriculum was crafted for classes VI-VIII on topics like self awareness, positive self esteem etc.
- Regular career- awareness workshops were organized by national and international field experts to give an insight to students of classes X-XII, about courses and careers.

LEARNING CENTRE

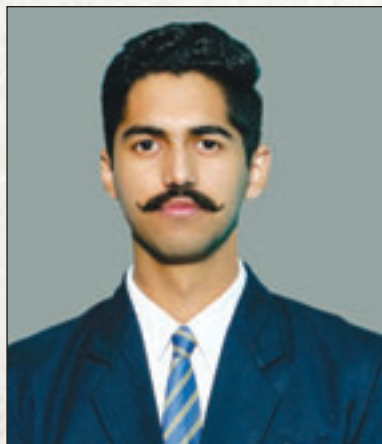
Aadesh Singh Sidhu

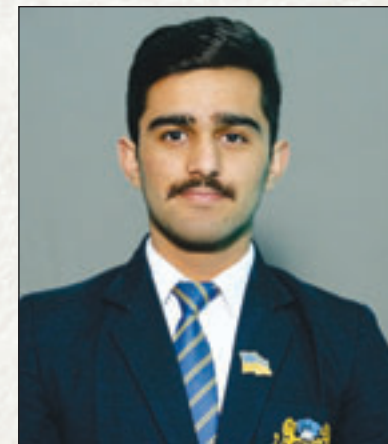
Ajaypal Singh Dhillon

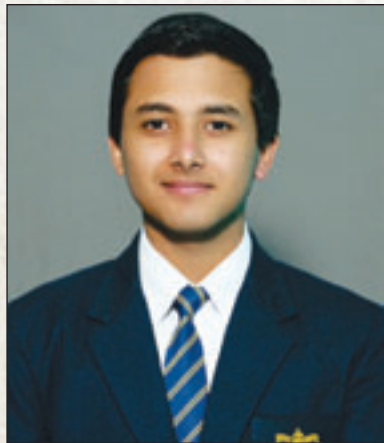
Anshnoor Kaur

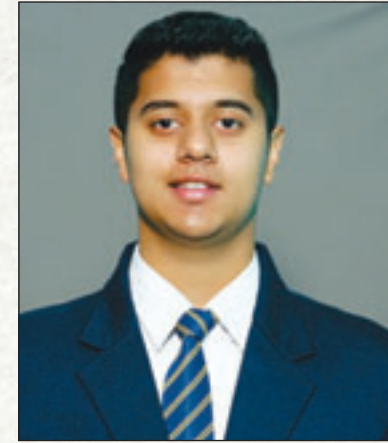
Jashan Preet Singh

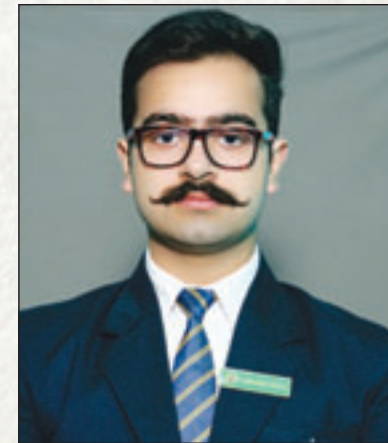
Kanishka Garg

Kanwardeep's frequent haunt is the gym. His love for body building and working out is unmatched. #BabbuMannFan



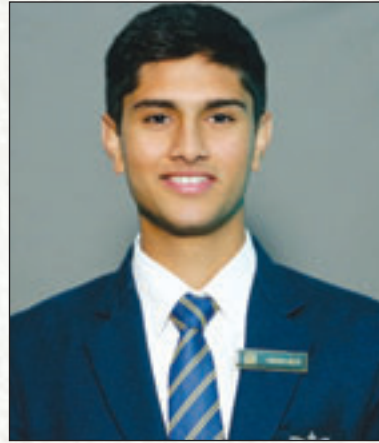
Ranvir Singh Chimni

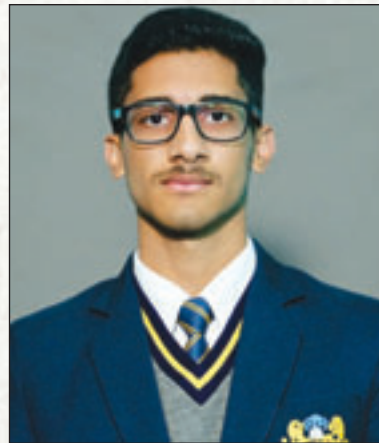
Angad Pathak

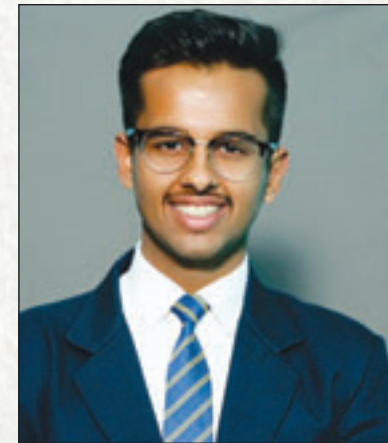
Maghan Preet Singh

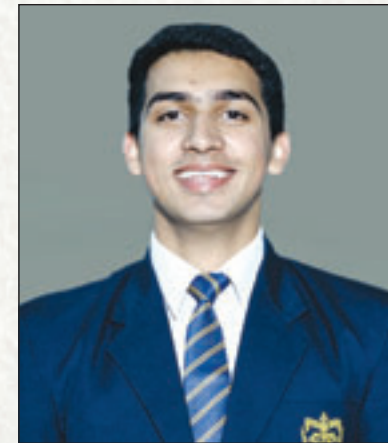
Anmol Dhaliwal

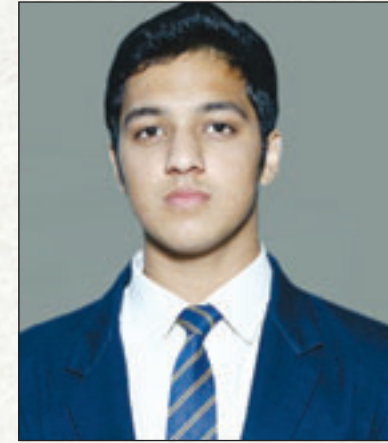
Mohit Kumar Sharma
