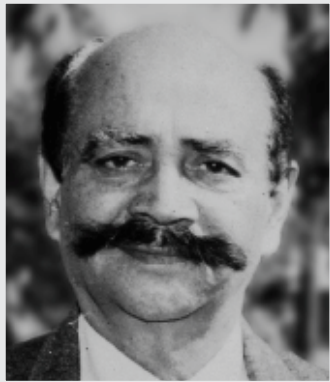

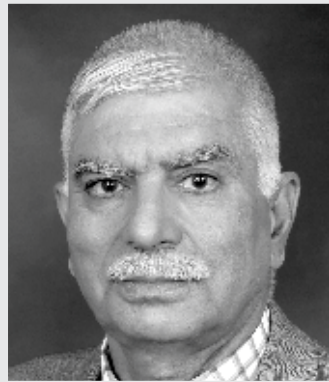

We do not rest on our laurels. Taking forward our commitment to provide an immersive, rigorous and stimulating learning experience to our students, we envision students with skills to adapt rapidly to a fast-changing world and

ACADEMIC REPORT

YPS provides a unique learning experience using a tempered blend of technology-aided learning coupled with a dedicated team of educators. Setting new benchmarks, this year saw exceptional results in both the ISC as well as the ICSE examination.

It is a matter of great pride that of the 70 students who sat for the ISC examination, 19 students scored 90% and above marks and 31 scored 80% and above. All students scored above 60%. Tarandeep Kaur, who was also the school Head Girl, scored 98.5% and topped the Tricity in the Non Medical stream. Anshnoor Kaur scored 97.25% in Commerce and Aaliya Sachar scored

98.5% in Humanities respectively.

In the ICSE examination, out of 107 students, 40 students scored 90% and above and 44 scored 80% and above. All 107 students scored more than 60% marks. Joshvir Singh and Sidharth Goel scored 97.2% and were the top scorers.

It caters to students with specific needs, ranging from learning disabilities, knowledge gaps, skill gaps to behavioural disorders. A need-based assessment is done to identify the problem. Students are taught by well qualified staff through

assistive technology like audio-visual aids, diagrams, cue cards, and e-readers. The Learning Centre also sensitizes students with the implementation of a 'Buddy System'.

NIOS – National Institute of Open Schooling

The school prepares students to appear for the NIOS Board. The students who opt for the Open School Board can choose from an array of subjects as per their choice. For the session 2019-2020, a total of four students have been enrolled for NIOS at both Secondary and Senior Secondary levels. The performance of last year's students was commendable with all students clearing their exams successfully.

ROUNDGLASS

With the vision to develop Social Emotional Skills of students, the school partnered with 'Roundglass' to run a school wellbeing program as an intrinsic part of Value Education curriculum. The curriculum helped students in managing self, becoming self and socially social aware, honing relationship skills and gauging situations to make responsible decisions.

AFS INTERCULTURAL PROGRAMS

With an aim to maximize global learning opportunities to our students, YPS collaborated with AFS Intercultural Programs. On 14th September, the AFS Member Schools Meeting took place at Hyderabad Public School, Begumpet. The Director, Maj. Gen. TPS Waraich (Retd), attended the Meet to exchange best practices with heads of other renowned schools of the country.

From 16th -17th November, Eknoor Kaur, Harshdeep Kaur and Khushi Dhanoa, attended the first Regional AFS Meet at Selaqui International School. They participated in the Community Service Project in a Government School, helping transform a classroom into a model classroom. The AFS will facilitate intercultural student exchange programmes this year.

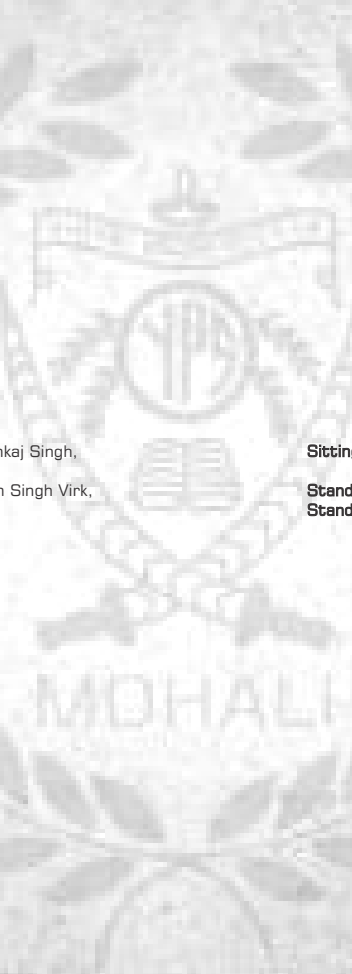
