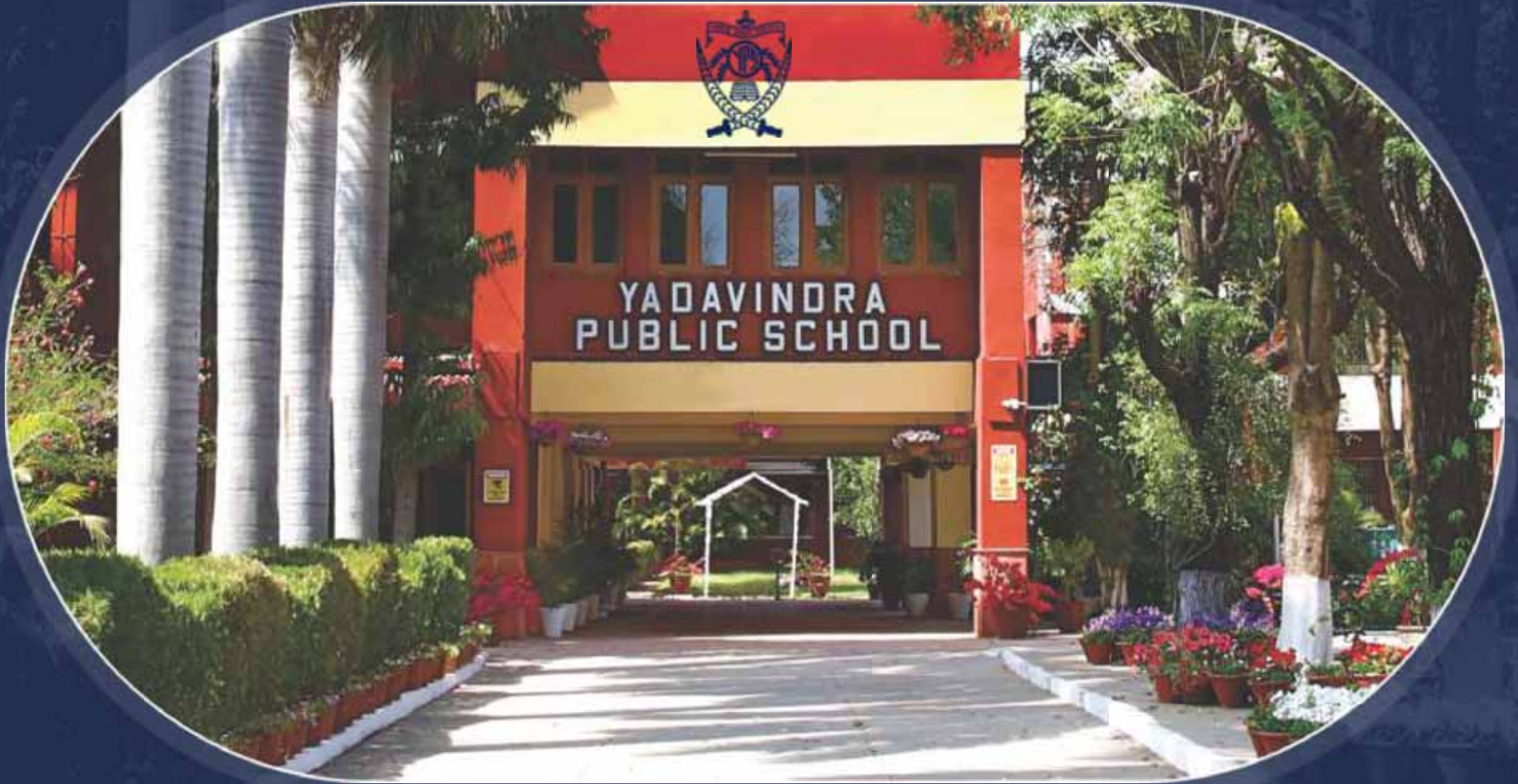

INTERNATIONAL AWARD FOR YOUNG PEOPLE (IAYP)

The DEAS or the IAYP(International Award for Young People) which we undertake at YPS is an international scheme which was formed by Prince Phillip in 1956 to encourage students between 14 to 24 years of age to follow youth activities, help the society and environment and learn outside the classroom. There are four sections: Adventurous Journey, Skills, Physical Recreation and Voluntary Service.

Over 50 students enrolled themselves for the Bronze Award, out of which only 20 qualify.

IAYP has three levels of the Award: Bronze, Silver and Gold, each representing different stages of achievement. It also has an additional fifth section - The Residential Project. The participants at this stage are required to undertake a shared living experience away from home, fostering teamwork and personal development in a residential setting.



Students learn qualities of camaraderie, teamwork, resilience and leadership which public schools like ours also stress upon in order to foster personal growth and well-rounded skill development of the students.

SOCIALLY USEFUL PRODUCTIVE WORK (SUPW) – 2023

SUPW aims at holistic development of the students, enabling them to develop the habit to work as a community, encourage community thinking, increase awareness of scientific advancements and help the less fortunate.



The following social and community based projects have been taken up by our students in this session:

For this, the school tied up with an organization called 'Karo Sambhav' which is a registered organization and works across the nation. Yadavindrians handed over nearly 35 kilograms of e-waste for proper disposal and thus acted as eco warriors.
- Having sensitivity towards the elderly in the society, our young citizens of the school also collaborated with HelpAge India, a registered organization working for four decades for the betterment and well-being of the elderly in the society and contributed an amount of more than 2 lakh.

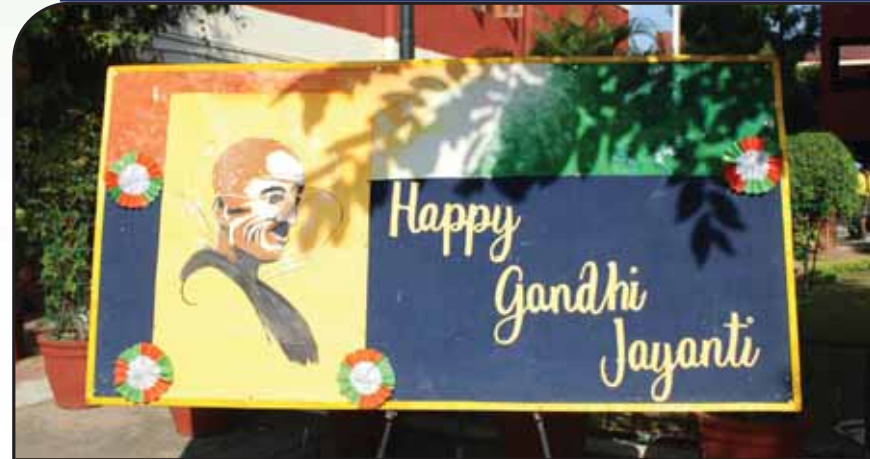

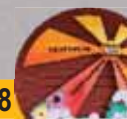
